Auckland Girls' Grammar School prepares students for study at Universities and other tertiary institutions. Our wide range of academic and vocational courses enable our students to achieve excellent results in national qualification assessments and examinations.

We offer a wide range of courses from the following learning areas:

Academic Programmes:

Full Year Studies (47 weeks) Year 9 – Year 12 (around 13–17 years of age)

Term Studies (min 5–max 10 weeks/term) Year 9 – Year 12

Short-Term Individual Buddies Programme (min 2 weeks – max 4 weeks)

Short-Term Group Programme (min 2 weeks – max 4 weeks)

Full Year Studies:

- Students will complete a programme of study across the full school academic year
- Students typically start their programmes at the beginning of the year
- Students will follow our academic programmes and sit all the exams/assessments set by the school/NZQA

Term Studies:

- Students will study one term or more with us
- Minimum 5 weeks and maximum 10 weeks/term
- Students can start their studies at the beginning of each term
- Students will follow our academic programmes and sit for all the exams/assessments set by the school

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Short-Term Individual Buddies Programme

- Students can start their programme at anytime within the academic calendar year
- Minimum duration of study is 2 weeks and maximum 4 weeks
- Students will join their buddies (2 buddies will be allocated for each student) classes
- Students are not required to sit any exams or assessments

Short-Term Groups Programme

- The group can start their programme at anytime within the academic calendar year
- Advance booking needed to guarantee your place with us
- We offer three study options under this programme:

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IMMIGRATION MATTERS

Student visa

- Full Year students must apply for a student visa through Immigration New Zealand
- One Term students do not need to apply for a student visa but must obtain a general visitor visa from Immigration New Zealand
- Short-term students who are studying for less than 12 weeks do not need to apply for a student visa but must do to obtain a general visitor visa from Immigration New Zealand
- Group students do not need to apply students visa if the programme is less than 12 weeks but must apply for a visitor visa

Working rights for the Full Year students

- Only full-time/ Full Year, Years 12 and 13 students can apply for a variation of conditions to their current student visa which would then allow them to work for up to 20 hours/week and full-time during the Christmas/New Year vacation period
- The student needs to provide both written permission from the school and parental consent to Immigration New Zealand in order to apply for the variation of conditions

Guardian Visa for one parent

- Only one legal guardian of the holder of a student visa will be granted a Guardian Visa
- Guardians who wish to work may apply for a variation of conditions to their Guardian Visa to allow for part-time work between 9.30am – 2.30pm Monday–Friday (inclusive)
