PATHWAYS

English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

- Three intakes per year March, July, November
- 12-week programme
- Leads to most undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD programmes

Foundation Studies

- Taught exclusively at UP Education in Wellington
- 6-18-month programmes
- IELTS 4.5 to 6.0
- Guaranteed pathway to undergraduate degree
- Scholarship opportunity for high achievers

Graduate/Postgraduate Diplomas

Graduate and postgraduate diplomas can be a pathway into Master degrees (ie. students want to continue in a field different from their undergraduate major).

Credit Transfer and Exemptions

- If students already have a tertiary-level qualification, or part of one, they can apply for academic credit transfer or exemptions from required courses at the University.
- This might provide students with advanced standing or reduced workload for their study at the University



STUDY ABROAD / FIRST YEAR ABROAD

Study Abroad

- Available at undergraduate and postgraduate level
- Students can select courses from any subject area, some courses may have restrictions
- Students usually nominate 6-8 subjects and they eventually study 3-4
- Study time is usually 6 months or 1 year (1 to 2 trimesters)
- Undergraduate student must have completed at least one year at their home university

First Year Abroad

 Same as Study Abroad, but for students who aren't currently enrolled in a university (students can only choose first year courses)

Points vs. Credits

The value of most courses is usually 15 points (3.75 US credits/7.5 ECTS) or 20 points (5 US credits/10 ECTS) – based on recommendations from Victoria University of Wellington.

One point typically requires about 10 hours of student work, including both, scheduled contact time (lectures, tutorials, laboratories, workshops, etc.) and individual (or group) study.



PHD STUDIES

PhD / Doctoral Programmes

- Usually completed within 3-4 years
- PhDs in NZ are research only
- Three application rounds per year at Victoria University of Wellington (students must apply before 1 March, 1 July or 1 November)

Why PhD in NZ?

- International PhD students only pay domestic fees
- PhD students usually get full-time work rights, partner gets open work visa and children get enrolled as domestic students in NZ state schools

Why PhD at Victoria University of Wellington?

- Easy online application system
- No need to identify supervisor (supervisor will be matched with applicant) – however, outreach to academic highly recommended to check possible supervision
- Expression of Research Interest for initial application (full research proposal is written with supervisor in first year)
- · Generous scholarship opportunity

ACCOMMODATION & LIVING EXPENSES

Accommodation

Halls of Residence

- 12 halls (catered + self-catered halls)
- Almost all dietary requirements can be catered for
- Alcohol free floors and female only floors (selected halls only)

Homestay

Living in a family environment

Private Accommodation

Can be tricky to organise from overseas and to find during peak seasons

Age groups

- 17↓: homestay family + catered hall
- 18+19: catered hall + homestay + private accommodation
- 20↑: self-catered hall + catered hall (if space available) + homestay + private accommodation

Living Expenses (estimated expenses for one academic year)

- For visa purposes, Immigration New Zealand requires NZ\$20,000
- Realistic for a university student is NZ\$20,000-22,000 (depending on lifestyle) per year



All Halls of Residence are within the city centre, except Helen Lowry Hall (which provides a free daily shuttle – up to 10 min. drive to city).

WORK RIGHTS

Working in NZ

The authorising agency for student work rights and post study work visa is Immigration New Zealand.

Student Work Rights (full degree students)
Usually 20 hours per week and full-time during scheduled holidays.
